

**Hacklebarney Chapter Conservation Project**  
**Stream Planting**  
**Whippany River**  
**9:00 am to 1:00 pm**  
**Saturday, July 25, 2009**

Hacklebarney Chapter is starting to work with the Natural Resources Division of Morris Parks to improve the stream environment on the upper Whippany River.

As our first step in this direction, we are going to work on an area near the Morris County Soil Conservation District's nursery across from Lewis Morris Park along Route 24 in Morris Township on July 25<sup>th</sup>. It's a three step process:

1. Remove invasive plants (mainly multi-flora rose).
2. Install deer fencing.
3. Replace invasives with native plants.

Please wear work clothes – long sleeve shirts, jeans, and work shoes. The chapter has work gloves that will be available, and we will also provide water. Morris Parks will provide all of the necessary tools for the activity.

To get there from the Morristown Green, drive west on Route 24 towards Mendham. You will pass Washington Valley Road on the right, and then Whitehead Road. After passing Whitehead Road, there is a small, gravel road on the north side of Route 24 across from Lewis Morris Park leading towards the river. The road entrance is at a break in the guardrail. Follow the road across a small bridge. You will find places to park after crossing the bridge near the nursery.
